## JOB OVERVIEW

Ensures the effectiveness of IT operations by leading the delivery, implementation, and maintenance of IT products and services and promoting the technological advancement of IT within TSA.

## JOB RESPONSIBILITIES

- Develops a multi-million-dollar budget, oversees budget reviews for all TSA IT operations, and makes budget expenditures as needed.
- Manages large and complex IT programs that support TSA's operational mission.
- Maintains IT operations by developing acquisition strategy and plans, partnering with various parties to provide data communications support, and providing agile application design and development capabilities.
- Oversees IT support functions for all TSA locations, both domestic and international.
- Identifies opportunities and risks for delivering IT services and ensures the delivery of IT applications, processes, and services align with the TSA mission, vision, and goals.
- Establishes and implements IT policies, procedures, and processes of direction and control to ensure objectives are achieved, risks are managed appropriately, and resources are used strategically with consideration of emerging technologies within the industry.
- Advises the Assistant Administrator (AA) and Deputy Assistant Administrator (DAA) on operations stability, IT requirements, and creative solutions to program issues. Manages cybersecurity risks by strategically managing organizational resources, technology, and operational processes.

## JOB SKILLS

- Oversees major IT operations, related domestic and international programs, and activities involving significant stakeholder interaction.
- Applies program management product support methods, concepts, and techniques to direct the strategic planning and development of IT operations and program goals and objectives.
- Establishes collaborative relationships with internal and external stakeholders.

## EXECUTIVE CORE QUALIFICATIONS(ECQ)
